

Branislav Anđelković (B.A. 1988, M.A. 1994, Ph.D. 2003, University of Belgrade, Serbia) is Assistant Professor of Near Eastern Archaeology in the Department of Archaeology of the Faculty of Philosophy, University of Belgrade. His research focuses on the Naqada culture, the process of state formation, paleopolitics and international relations in the fourth millennium B.C. Since 1987, he has participated in fieldwork in Serbia and the Near East. He edited *Journal of the Serbian Archaeological Society* from 2005 to 2008. In September 2011 he delivered (by invitation) a public lecture and a seminar at the Yale University (the Yale Egyptological Institute in Egypt and the Department of Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations). Along with his main areas of research, he has published extensively on the Belgrade Mummy (Nesmin), and corpus of Egyptian antiquities in Serbia. Member of the International Association of Egyptologists and the American Schools of Oriental Research.
